

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (N.S.S.)

The NSS unit of our college strives to inculcate in students a sense of social responsibility and constant commitment to the community. NSS volunteers make it a priority to make sure that everyone in need receives assistance in order to raise their level of living and live with dignity. The total strength of the unit is 200 volunteers who have enrolled themselves with the aim of creating a difference within themselves and society. The unit comprises 100 males and 100 females. It comprises activities at the college, area, and university levels.

COLLEGELEVELPROJECT

1. INTERNATIONAL YOGA DAY-21st JUNE, 2022

The NSS Unit celebrated the 7th International Yoga Day on 21st June 2022. The programme was conducted in association with Patanjali Foundation. The function began with a brief introduction to Yoga Day by Mrs. Poonam Gupta, Yoga Instructor. Mrs. Poonam Gupta demonstrated Yoga with Yoga prayer, after which a few warm-ups and simple asanas were performed by the students and teachers, and the importance of asanas was also explained. 46 students (25-boys and 21-girls) and the college's teaching and non-teaching staff members attended the event with great enthusiasm.

2. GURU PURNIMA CELEBRATION – 13th JULY, 2022

Guru Purnima is celebrated to honor our teachers, the importance of Gurus, and the extraordinary bond between a Guru and Shishya (disciple), the NSS Unit prepared greeting cards for all the teachers. Students also distributed roses and chocolates to express their love and respect for the teaching staff.

3. ORIENTATION SESSION BY UNITED WAY – 19th JULY, 2022

To make students understand the importance of the environment and prepare for sustainable life choices, the NSS unit has organized an orientation session in association with United Way Mumbai. The session was conducted by Mrs. Mitali Mutta, a member of United Way Mumbai, working in the department of environment. The speaker focused on how plastic accumulation in the seas and oceans are creating a hazard for the environment and how we as a human being bring solutions to help nature. 33 students (12-boys and 21-girls) attended the orientation.

4. WORKSHOP SESSION BY HEMA FOUNDATION AND IDF – 27th JULY, 2022

To make the students aware of the importance of values and their implication in our daily lives, the NSS unit in association with the HEMA foundation and IDF, organized a workshop on value education. The workshop was conducted by 2 eminent speakers – Mr. Sunder Iyer and Mr. Dheeraj Sonar, they focused on the importance of values in the overall social development of one's personality. Videos were shown to students to grasp their attention on the importance of values. The workshop was greatly appreciated by the students. 75 students (45-girls and 30-boys) attended the session.

5. RAKHI SELLING - 23rd JULY, 2022 5th AUGUST, 2022

To inculcate marketing and communication skills in the volunteers. To focus on the importance of Skills - Entrepreneurship Programme towards better livelihood. were prepared by the mentally challenged students, and the money received by selling of these rakhis was given back to this organization. Students understood the importance of marketing and how they can focus more on these areas. Rakhis were purchased by students, teaching and non-teaching staff too. 14 NSS volunteers (11-boys and 3-girls) volunteered.

6. NSS ORIENTATION TO FIRST-YEAR STUDENTS – 13th AUGUST, 2023

NSS orientation was organized for the first-year students to guide and motivate them to participate and enroll them as a volunteer of NSS. The orientation was done by Dr. Mrs. Gracy D'souza and I/C Principal Mrs. Pranita Kamath, former NSS PO and Area coordinator. The chief speakers shared their viewpoints about NSS and how it helps in the major development of not only an individual but also society as a whole. Students were truly motivated by our speakers and enrolled themselves as NSS volunteer in large numbers. 110 students (50-boys and 60-girls) attended the orientation.

7. DRY WASTE COLLECTION - 18th AUGUST, 2022

Students collected dry waste from homes and nearby areas for recycling, promoting effective waste management and environmental protection. 50 students (14- boys and 36- girls) joined the collection drive.

8. ORIENTATION BY ANUBHAV YOUTH OF DEVELOPMENT- 18th AUGUST, 2022

To make students understand the community in which they work, to develop among themselves a sense of social and civic responsibility. Mr. Sandesh Lagle inculcated the values and roles of youths and their importance in the upliftment of society among the students. Students were educated with the 5Cs that ensures the overall personality - Competence, Confidence, Connection, Character and Caring. The orientation was attended by 70 students (25- boys and 45- girls)

9. SEMINAR ON HOW NSS CAN CHANGE YOUR LIFE – 06th SEPTEMBER, 2022

The speaker of the seminar was Prof. Prajesh Trotsky. The objective behind the session was to help the student to grow individually and also as a group. Speaker motivated volunteers to dedicate their lives to the objective of NSS and how one's dedication can lead to success not only in students' life but also in the development and upbringing of society as a whole, how NSS can bring a huge impact on one's career as well. The seminar was attended by 60 students (30-boys and 30 -girls)

10. TALK ON DEMOCRACY AND SECULARISM – 12th SEPTEMBER, 2022

Mr. Sandesh Lagle emphasized the importance of diversity, Indian culture, to imbibe a sense of brotherhood and the importance of democracy in our country. The motto of NSS itself says: 'NOT ME BUT YOU', keeping this in the minds of students, our speaker focused on the importance of democracy and secularism and how they can help in the moral development of an individual democracy, and secularism in moral development and personal growth. 47 students (23- boys and 24- girls) attended.

11. SEMINAR ON "HOW TO RELIEVE STRESS FROM STUDENT'S LIFE" - 23rd SEPTEMBER, 2022

The speaker B.K Reena emphasized meditation and relaxation techniques to manage stress. The objective of the seminar was to practice techniques to elicit the relaxation response. Students were taught different techniques of relaxation and how to calm one's minds, it was an interactive session.

12. NSS FOUNDATION DAY- CELEBRATION - 24th SEPTEMBER, 2022

On the occasion of NSS Foundation Day, volunteers organized a programme, EX NSS leaders, Mr. Satya (IDF), Dr. Mrs. Gracy D'souza, Shri. C.A Shailesh M. Palsuledesai. were invited as chief guests. The objective of the celebration was to acquire leadership qualities and democratic attitudes and practice national integration and social harmony. Students organized poem recitations gave a speech on the importance of NSS, and

activities and motivated them.

13. GANDHI JAYANTI CELEBRATION – 2nd OCTOBER, 2023

As a part of Gandhi Jayanti, a poster-making competition was organized on the lives and values given by Gandhiji. Students actively participated in the competition in large numbers. Posters on different views and thoughts taught by Gandhiji were presented. A pledge was also conducted by the students in keeping alive the morals taught by Gandhiji.

14. KANDIL MAKING AND DIYA SELLING- 15TH OCTOBER, 2022

The NSS volunteers sold diyas made by the physically challenged students, these diyas were purchased by the students, teaching, and non-teaching staff. The objective of this event was to inculcate marketing and communication skills of the volunteers. The money received from selling kandil and diyas was given for the education of physically challenged students.

15. CPR TRAINING- 19th OCTOBER, 2022

The objective of CPR training was to give confidence and knowledge to the students in general and NSS volunteers in particular so that they could help the victim by providing basic life support until proper medical help arrives. The experts urged the students to create awareness among the common public so as to act in an effective manner during emergencies. Followed by that, all the NSS volunteers were given a hands-on demonstration of the method of performing CPR using a mannequin.

16. STUDY METHOD AND AMBITION ACHIEVEMENT – 24th NOVEMBER, 2022

A session was conducted to help students to understand the concept of learning each and every content, rather than mugging up. The session was conducted by Mr. Sandesh Lalge. The speaker helped students in understanding what are their various fields through which they can excel and various methods in which they can boost their knowledge and morale.

17. CAMPUS CLEANING DRIVE:

The NSS unit organized a cleanliness drive at the college campus. Around 05 kgs of discarded plastic trash were collected during the cleanliness drive. Later, the plastic waste was disposed of properly.

18. SEMINAR ON WASTE MANAGEMENT – UNITED WAY – 15TH DECEMBER, 2022

A session was conducted by United Way Mumbai, for the NSS volunteers on the topic of waste management. Volunteers were made aware about the hazardous effects of wastes which can't be recycled, and how it ends up lying on the surface of land and water. Students were made aware about wet and dry waste, the process of its segregation and methods through which it can be recycled.

19. BAMBOO PRODUCT SELLING BY VIVEK SEVANGO- 26th JANUARY, 2023

On the occasion of Republic Day, the volunteers sold bamboo products which was made by the rural women's working in Vivek Seva Kendra, these products were purchased by the students during their 7 days NSS residential camp at the N.G.O. Students were taught about the importance of women's employability and how it is helpful for their daily lives. The products were purchased by the students, teaching and non-teaching staffs.

20. SESSION ON INNOVATIVE COURSES IN SKILL DEVELOPMENT 27th JANUARY, 2023

A session was conducted by Shree Ram Centre on the importance of skill development for the NSS volunteers, wherein they were made aware of various courses in paramedics, firefighting and beauty courses. Students learnt various fields in which they can pursue their careers and which will enhance their future prospectus.

21. GREEN VALENTINE DAY- 14th FEBRUARY, 2023

NSS unit of our college and Vivek college, together organized "Green Valentine's Day" to promote environmental awareness by planting saplings. Students planted saplings in their respective colleges and distributed plants among each other.
